From the Elementary School Family Liaison

I am excited to share with you all some of the recruitment and outreach efforts that have been occurring and also inform you of ways that you can help our cause!

As you may be aware, HoLa is the first charter school in New Jersey to offer low income families double entry in our lottery system. This means that when a family who lives in public housing, receives public assistance or qualifies for free/reduced lunch applies to our school, they get their name entered twice into the lottery. At HoLa, we believe that every child deserves a quality education. We also believe that a diverse student population benefits all of our students.

As Family Liaison and Dean of Students I have made it a priority to make sure that families who qualify can take advantage of our lottery preference. We have been in full outreach mode! I, along with other school representatives,, have been going into the community and knocking on doors and setting up tables at local events to get the word out about our wonderful school.

In addition, we have been

working side by side with the Hoboken Housing Authority. This brings us to our biggest outreach event yet. **On December 20th, we will be hosting a toy giveaway at one of the Hoboken Housing Authority buildings (411 Marshall Drive). The toy giveaway will be from 4-6pm. We need your help in collecting new, unwrapped toys for children ages 4-8.**

This toy giveaway is a great opportunity to give back to our community and also provide families a chance to learn about HoLa and apply for our school.

Toys will be collected until Dec. 19th and can be dropped off at the main office in either building. We also welcome parent volunteers for the actual event and other smaller scale outreach efforts that will continue throughout the month of December.
